A dazzling all-star cast with many famous faces will take you on a roller coaster ride of this classic novel adapted from Balzac. It stars Benjamin Voisin as a handsome but poor and amitious young poet who learns that money can buy anything. He follows his patroness (played by Cecile de France) to explore and delilght in the glamorous beau monde de Paris. This highly awarded film is epic in scope and represents grand French cinema at its best.

There are of course many more cinematic bonbons to be had, just take a look at the selection and pick your favourite genre. If you are a fan of crime thrillers then you may want to see "Maigret" which is based on a best-selling Georges Simenon novel. The legendary Gérard Depardieu brings to life the hugely entertaining and Inspector Jules Maigret who discovers the body of a beautiful young

woman. Paris, 1953. No witnesses, no identity. It is a pleasure to follow the story line and the ingenious clues. 88 minutes well spent.

Matisse Exhibition in Sydney - showing until 13 March 2022

Currently there is a unique and fascinating exhibition at the Art Gallery of NSW entitled 'Matisse: Life & Spirit, Masterpieces from the Centre Pompidou, Paris'. When I stayed in Paris I visited the galleries of Centre Pompidou daily due to the vibrant cultural life within and without the building. The building itself is a marvel of architecture, see image below on the left. The Henri Matisse (1869-1954) exhibition is the largest ever presented at Sydney and features over 100 of his famous works of art that include paintings, sketches and sculptures. Matisse travelled to Tahiti in the 1930s where he further developed his technique, and we recall the 'souvenirs de Tahiti' of clear bright blue images capturing the sky and the sea.
