On m'a invité à relater mon récent séjour en France en décembre dernier et surtout à expliquer la brièveté de ce voyage de seulement huit jours! Pour ma "retraite" je me suis offert ce cadeau trop extravagant. Le but? Assister à DEUX concerts de Patrick Bruel: un à Dijon, le 14 décembre puis l'autre, trois nuits plus tard, à Lyon!

Malgré la longueur des voyages, les délais à Brisbane, une entorse de cheville à Abou Dhabi en route pour Paris, les grèves SNCF importantes, les motos-taxis hors de prix pour traverser les embouteillages parisiens, j'ai boité d'un endroit à l'autre pour achever mon rêve de voir Patrick en concert.

Et quels concerts! Patrick est très énergique. Il chante une grande variété de chansons - ses plus grands succès des années 90 et 2000 que tout le public aime chanter.

À un moment, il insiste pour que toute la salle danse sur la valse de sa chanson, *L'amant de Saint Jean*. Il chante du rock, du pop et des ballades contemporaines, qui parlent des dangers des réseaux sociaux (*Louise*), des attentats (*Ce soir on sort*), des héros anonymes (*Héros*) ainsi que des chansons moins sérieuses (*She's gone, Rue Mouffetard*). Deux heures quarante minutes (deux fois) qui valaient tous ces efforts et ces dépenses pour y aller. Les meilleurs concerts de ma vie! Je dois ajouter que j'ai beaucoup aimé Dijon, petite ville avec une zone piétonne énorme et des rues animées, surtout ce samedi matin de décembre. Beaune, sur la route de Lyon m'a beaucoup plu aussi et Lyon, surtout le Vieux Lyon, était aussi impressionnant, malgré les manifestations.

P.S. La motivation pour voir Patrick en concert date de l'année 1992 ou 93 et de sa chanson *Place des Grands Hommes* qui parle d'une réunion d'amis après dix ans. En 1993, pendant un voyage scolaire en Nouvelle Calédonie, un étudiant a acheté un double-CD de Patrick. Ce même étudiant, Ben, m'a contacté en mai pour me dire qu'il avait un contrat de travail d'un mois à Reims, pendant La Coupe du Monde Féminine! Après plusieurs e-mails nous avons convenu d'un rendez-vous à Dijon pour le concert - après vingtcinq ans. Une autre raison du succès de ce voyage, malgré l'extravagance du projet!

Interesting facts about France

- The French Army was the first to use camouflage in 1915 (World War I). Initially it was confined to painting vehicles and weaponry in disruptive patterns to blend into the surrounding landscape. This painting was done by artists called *camoufleurs*. The French verb *camoufler* means, 'to make oneself up for the stage'.
- Cheese production in France is an ancient art: goats cheese dates back to at least 500AD, the blue-veined Roquefort was mentioned in records of an ancient monastery in Conques as early as 1070, and hard farm cheeses like Emmental started to appear in the 13th century. A French proverb claims "un fromage par jour de l'année" – there is a different cheese for every day of the year.
- The first projected movie screening was by French brothers Auguste and Louis Lumière on 28 December 1895. They used their invention the *cinématographe* (hence 'cinema') to show 10 films of about 50 seconds each at the *Salon Indien du Grand Café* in Paris. They made many more films but predicted that 'cinema is an invention without any future'.

Approval of changes to the AFT constitution

In January 2020, the Queensland Office of Fair Trading approved amendments to the AFT constitution (model rules), as voted on and passed at the General Meeting held on 1 December 2019. These amendments, include the additional membership category of Corporate Membership and the adoption of the new Model Rules Version 6 which aligns the AFT constitution with changes to the *Associations Incorporation Act* 1981.
